Winemaker Notes:


The 2013 Oakville Cabernet Sauvignon delivers aromas of black and blue fruits (blackberry, blackberry pie and black cherry), followed by mineral notes of wet stone and ash, a hint of raw beef, lavender and cedar notes, and a touch of light smoked paprika. This is a full-body wine, showing great juiciness, with ample dark, fleshy stone fruit flavors that are complemented by earthy notes. The wine has nice, firm tannins that are a trademark of the vintage. The finish is a mix of beautiful graphite, sweet oak and cigar box flavors.

Oakville Estate Vineyard

The Tamber Bey Oakville Estate is located at the southern end of Napa Valley's famous Oakville appellation, just north of Yountville. It has gravel/loam soils that are relatively shallow and well suited to Cabernet. The site enjoys early morning fog and late afternoon breezes influenced by the San Francisco Bay to the south. To encourage competition for sun, water and nutrients, Tamber Bey planted more than 9,500 vines in a tight planting formation on 3 acres.

About Tamber Bey

With a winery located in Calistoga at the Sundance Ranch, Tamber Bey is a family-owned and operated that produces wine from its two estate owned vineyards at the heart of the Napa Valley, the Estate Vineyard in the Oakville Appellation and the Deux Chevaux Vineyard in the Yountville Appellation, as well as sourced fruit from premium vineyards in Napa, Sonoma and Lake counties. The name Tamber Bey reflects the names of owner Barry Waitte's first two Arabian endurance horses, Tamborina (Tamber) and Bayamo (Bey).
